PAGE 2 -- PARENT COMMITMENT

In any human relationships, unmet expectations will be a cause for occasional conflict. To avoid conflict as much as possible, have attempted to lay out the expectations on the "Guidelines and Expectations" page of the website. Everything there was added out of a desire to function efficiently and according to high principles; not because any of us like following a rule list. Because we are dependent on parental oversight and responsibility, we ask you to read the information on the website and, as a reminder to yourself and commitment to this school year, to read the following carefully, initialing each item; then sign below: (Keep a copy on hand as a regular reminder.)

____ I understand that e-mail is the primary means of communication between GCT's tutors and administration and me as a parent, as well as my student. I will include a working email address and commit to checking and reading those e-mails regularly, responding to them appropriately.

____ I know the importance of being in touch and will let tutors know whenever possible if my child has to miss a class. I also understand that the tutors are very willing to respond to my e-mails about their classes or my student's progress, and will be in touch with them about how to best handle missed classes.

____ Understanding that class time is limited and that most of the work actually happens outside of it, I will oversee my student's schedule and homework, doing my best to have him/her prepared for every class. As much as is possible I feel confident that we can successfully meet the expectations for each class for which we registered.

____ I understand that Good Company Tutorials is not a school and does not take responsibility for my child's education. I am the home school parent. I also realize that, although it is not possible for all parents to stay in the building, I am encouraged to be there as much as possible.

____ I have read the website (or re-read it if returning), including the "Expectations" page, so that I go into this year understanding how Good Company works and making an informed decision about our commitment there, including behavioral expectations and homework requirements for each class. I will do my best to make sure my students understand these guidelines as well as reminders as they come out, and understand that the tutors will be assuming that I am familiar with the guidelines.

____ I understand that because space in the building is limited and the tutors are busy teaching classes, it is difficult to have too many students waiting in the building. I agree to keep this in mind, not dropping my student(s) off early or having them stay late either to spend extra time with friends or because it is more convenient for me. In leaving my children between classes, I acknowledge that there is no formal supervision of students, and that they can be trusted to take care of themselves in my absence and to respect other people and the guidelines.

____ I have indicated on the registration form when my child(ren) will be in the building or on the grounds before, between, or after classes. If that changes, I will let someone know, as I understand your need to keep track of students on the grounds. I also understand that, although there are adults in the building, there is no format for watching what every student is doing all the time.

____ Recognizing that careless testing procedures compromise the integrity of my child's grades, transcripts, and character, as well as that of Good Company Tutorials, when my student is sent home with an exam, I will carefully proctor it according to the guidelines. This means that I will watch that my student takes the test without any external help and without technology nearby, and I will seal the test in an envelope and sign the seal. I understand that cheating and/or plagiarism means a 0 on the test or assignment.

____ I understand that, while it is okay for my responsible student to be in the building and on the grounds between classes, GCT is not expected to be a drop-off spot for socializing; I will do my part to pick up my child in reasonable lengths of time and to be willing to do my share in being another adult in the parking lot or building when I am available. I will take full responsibility for the supervision of my younger children.

____ I understand that students are to stay at the building unless leaving at the end of their school day or with a parent. If my child is to drive himself/herself, I will let you know.

____ When problems arise, I will follow the biblical guidelines (Matthew 18) of going directly to the person involved, getting other, appropriate people involved as necessary if the problem is still unresolved. I will also encourage my student to do the same.

PAGE 3 - RELEASE OF LIABILITY

1. ASSUMPTION OF THE RISKS AND RELEASE. I am voluntarily participating in this activity, and I am participating entirely at my own risk. I assume full responsibility for personal injury to myself and my family members, and further release and discharge Good Company Tutorials and its staff and agents for injury, loss or damage arising out of my or my family's use of or presence upon the facilities or travel to or from at Good Company Tutorials, whether caused by the fault of myself, my family, Good Company Tutorials or other third parties. Risks include, but are not limited to, physical or psychological injury, pain, suffering, illness, disfigurement, temporary or permanent disability (including paralysis), economic or emotional loss, and death.

2. INDEMNIFICATION. I agree to indemnify and defend Good Company Tutorials against all claims, causes of action, damages, judgments, costs or expenses, including attorney fees and other litigation costs, which may in any way arise from my or my family's use of or presence upon the facilities of Good Company Tutorials.

3. CONSENT. This temporary authority will begin on September 1, 2024 and will remain in effect until terminated in writing by the undersigned or June 1, 2025, whichever occurs first. Good Company Tutorials shall have the following powers:

- a. The power to seek appropriate medical treatment or attention on behalf of my child as may be required by the circumstances, including without limitation, that of a licensed medical physical and/or a hospital.
- b. The power to authorize medical treatment or medical procedures in any emergency situation; and
- c. The power to make appropriate decisions regarding clothing, bodily nourishment and shelter.

5. NO DURESS. I agree and acknowledge that I am under no pressure or duress to sign this Agreement and that I have been given a reasonable opportunity to review it before signing. I further agree and acknowledge that I am free to have my own legal counsel review this Agreement if I so desire.

6. ARM'S LENGTH AGREEMENT. This Agreement and each of its terms is the product of an arms' length negotiation between the Parties. In the event any ambiguity is found to exist in the interpretation of this Agreement, or any of its provisions, the Parties, and each of them, explicitly reject the application of any legal or equitable rule of interpretation which would lead to a construction either "for" or "against" a particular party based upon their status as the drafter of a specific term, language, or provision giving rise to such ambiguity.

7. ENFORCEABILITY. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this Agreement, whether standing alone or as applied to a particular occurrence or circumstance, shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of this Agreement or any of other applications of such provision, as the case may be, and such invalid or unenforceable provision shall be deemed not to be a part of this Agreement.
